

## PE and Sports Grant

The government have provided additional funding up to 2020 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary school head teachers.



This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

### Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested.

Cherry Tree Primary School has decided to use the money to:

- Have employed a Qualified sports coach to work alongside all class teachers and other staff to strengthen teaching and learning of PE across school
- To enable the PE co-ordinator to work alongside the other member of staff to upskill staff to support children who are more able in PE / sports
- support and engage the least active children in physical activities
- pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs
- improve resources to support the development of the subject
- To provide Bikeability and Bike Maintenance Course.

The impact of the use of the grant will be reviewed at the end of every year.
